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The first social medicine housing in Canada is being built at 150 Dunn Avenue, a collaboration between University Health Network (UHN), the City of Toronto and United Way of Greater Toronto.

This project will provide 51 unhoused neighbours in Toronto with a place to call home, while integrating service delivery and healthcare access on-site to help tenants stabilize, recover, and heal. It aims to go beyond traditional supportive housing as an innovative, new approach to providing care.

Parkdale has a long-standing history of welcoming new neighbours and is proud to be a home for so many diverse groups of people.
