The central purpose of West Neighbourhood House is to enable less-advantaged individuals, families and groups in the community to gain greater control over their lives and community.

Seniors' Community Development is looking for an energetic, passionate, and creative individual to work with a vibrant and diverse community of seniors, adults and youth at Parkdale and 248 Ossington locations, as well as occasionally at Toronto Island.

The successful candidate will be familiar with community development model used in program planning, delivery, and evaluation, with focus on diversity, equity, and inclusion. They will bring an excellent interpersonal and communication skills as well as artistic talents and skills to be used in program cultural animation. As a member of the Seniors Community Development team, the successful candidate will also participate in team, Unit and House-wide activities as required.

West Neighbourhood House is actively seeking qualified applications from Indigenous, Black and People of Colour, people with disabilities, women and people of all sexual orientations and gender identities/expressions. Applicants with lived experience as a participant of West Neighbourhood House programs, or related programming from similar organizations, are also strongly encouraged to apply.

Responsibilities:

- Develop, organize and outreach for various health promotion, recreational, social and educational activities;
- Deliver activities or ensure they are delivered by volunteers/participants or external service providers;
- Identify local health needs, engage community partners and build capacity to address social determinants of health;
- Monitor all activities and interactions between participants to ensure a safe and comfortable environment, resolving crises or conflicts between members;
- Facilitate the involvement of seniors/volunteers in program planning/delivery and evaluation;
- Buy refreshments and ensure program supplies and materials, get transported to locations, collect and compile statistical information;
- Organize large events open to the community, promote the events, train, schedule and monitor volunteers and students to assist with the implementation and animation of activities;

- Conduct working group monthly meetings, facilitate workshops, provide and/or arrange interpretation, organize transportation and represent the agency when out in the community;
- Organize and co-facilitate workshops with groups of seniors and youth; and provide on-going support and assistance to project volunteers and participants;
- Prepare and design of brochures, flyers and other publications;
- Assist in the development and carrying out evaluation;
- Responsible for collecting quantitative and qualitative data;
- Participate as a member of the Seniors' Community Development team;
- Assist the Seniors' Community Development team with program delivery.

Qualifications:

- Excellent knowledge of community-based seniors programming in a multi-cultural, multi-lingual environment, with particular emphasis on the effects of the ageing process, the capabilities and limitations of seniors **as obtained through experience or training and education in health promotion, recreation management, gerontology activation, community development or community nursing**;
- Awareness and understanding of a safe environment free from harassment, discrimination, oppression;
- Ability to work with groups of seniors; understanding and respecting self-determination;
- Experience working in community-based programs/ using a community development approach with colleagues, participants and volunteers;
- Demonstrate social and conflict resolution skills while working with diverse groups of people;
- Experience in interpretation and translation methods;
- Demonstrated good communication skills;
- Fluency in a language relevant to West NH catchment area oral and written as an asset;
- Ability to work independently and as a member of a team;
- Ability to work some evenings and weekends;
- Strong knowledge of social media tools and Office 365;
- Knowledge of data base Alayacare is an asset;
- Familiarity with the local community would be an asset.
